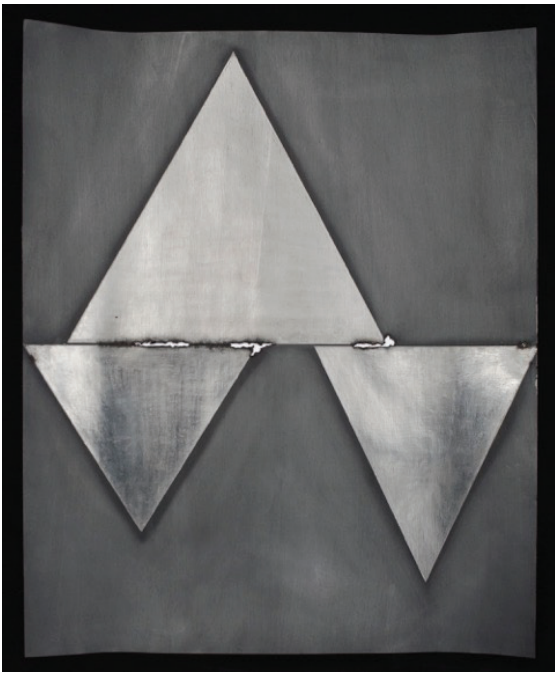
Things I'm Loving

*Shimmers Stilled Blazoning*



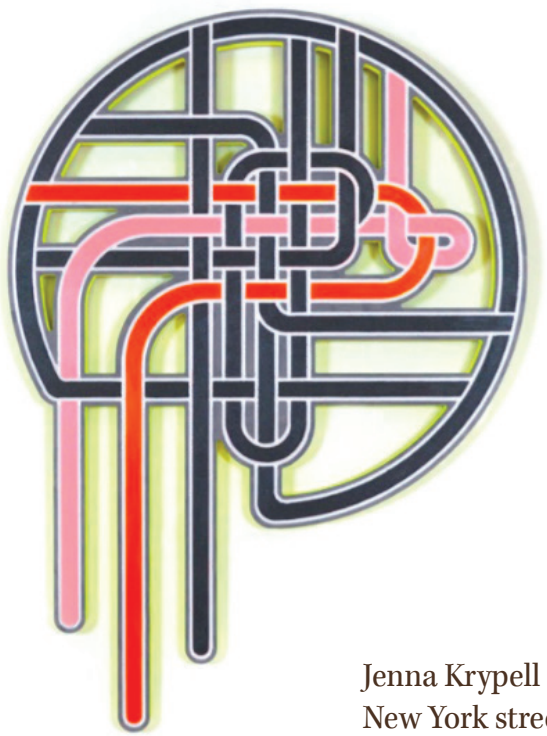
David Goldes,
